Land taxes on private land were established in 1900. The amount of tax varied with the type and location of the lands. The higher taxes were paid for land within the limits of a town followed by those favourable to farming, forest and grazing areas. Land in Agana was valued first and lands located far away from Agana received a tax reduction of 20 percent.

Sororate: "a rule favoring the marriage of a widower with the sister of his deceased wife." (Hurdock 1960:29)

Term shouldn't be applied to societies where sororate unions occur only occasionally or incidentally - (1960:29).
